Dear Miss Phillips:

I have just returned from a tour of the United States with the Never-Hitch Club and I thought I would write to tell you about all the '43's I saw.

Our club is now composed of Betty Patrick, O'Donnell Strahle, Kenny Coleman, Rosalie Francis, Betty Roach, Lillie Cunningham, and myself. Ernie Prudhomme, Wayne Brannon, and Patty Osha resigned from the club recently to plunge into the sea of matrimony.

Death Valley was one of the first places we visited. There we saw Eugene Dennis, who had a pick and shovel. He said he was looking for gold. In Maryville we saw six of our Marys. There were a lot of Linton kids in Maryville. In a place called the Gambill and Steele Pool Room, Jacquie Mead and her accompanist, Marjie Cornett, were performing, but were trying to transfer their contract to the Clark Coffee Cafe. The Metro-Magruder Opera Company had asked them to entertain at the annual Sophisticated Barn Dance held by "Pompadour" Pete Sarris, but they left with us for Hollywood.

In Hollywood we met Barbara Edwards, who is now the artist for the comic strip, Super-cat. At the Brown Derby we ate with Phyllis Talbott, famous book critic. She chose my latest story, "Careless Cattle" and the "Diary of Dola Imrie" as the outstanding books of the year. We went to see the movie "Gable Blevens and His Eleven Little Blevenses." He received an academy award for his outstanding performance from the great director of 20th Century Flops, Paul Geryak.

Nearby in Los Angeles we heard The Music Makers Swing Band: Maddox, Pope, Dean, and their soloist, Remy Voisin. The new members are Bette Anderson who plays a bazooka, Betty Callihan, who passes out the music, and Margaret Brogan, who takes up the music. Bob Thornton owns The First National Bank there. He employs anyone who promises to vote for him in the election for president this fall. So far he has a one-man bank.

On a ranch in Colorado we stopped for a while to see Junior Barnard, Frank Barlick, and Lester Laughlin. They had taken over a ghost town and fixed it up. You should have seen it. Two of the stores had familiar names, The Lavelda Bales Hay Company and The Emma Brannon Feed Store. On a street called Kline Avenue near the Coakley Pop Works stood The Borders Car Lot. Mr. and Mrs. Juanita Bredeweg Jackson lived south of the Borders'. Ruth Mathena and Margaret Murdock were running a poultry house, selling chickens of all flavors.

At the entrance Millie Browning was turning on the drinking fountain for tired shoppers. Across the street Verna Begerman was taking orders for Jack Walton's custom-made toothpicks, which come in sizes to fit all teeth. Jack is now a millionaire.

Our next stop was Terre Haute. We dropped into the Rogers Tea Shop and found Katy, who has made ginger tea the popular beverage of the Middle West since the downfall of coffee sales in 1943. Schmitt, Sisil & Smith are running a marriage agency on Wabash Avenue. Last month they received pleas from Earl

Mitchell, Paul Rusher, and Gene Walton. Bob Harrell owns the biggest flower shop in town, specializing in the "Donald" Rose and the "O'Hern" Iris.

By this time we were getting homesick for Linton so we started on our way. While passing through Sullivan, whom should we see but Thelma Smith, Lillian Graves, and Virginia Wilson, who own a dairy next to the "Barn." Eugene Cole and Junior O'Hern are now the esteemed proprietors of the "Barn," which Linton boys used to like so well. Remember how Linton and Sullivan were always rivals in everything, Miss Phillips?

The first person we saw when we arrived in Linton was Kathleen O'Connor. Imagine our surprise when she told us that she and Betty Jarmon operate a boat-club called the "Courtship" on a stripper pond east of town. She also told us that Betty Jane Wills, manages the Snack, a date society for lonesome hearts. It seems that both places have large crowds and threaten to put each other out of business.

We also ran into three "43" alumni still in alphabetical order—Harris, Heenan and Huber, Attorneyesses at law. They were handling the case of Bill Maddison, Jr., vs. Linton High School for dropping Billy III into the swimming pool during the contest to determine the most beautiful children of graduates. 




The American Legion Award is presented by the Frank Courtney American Legion Post to the student who has attained the highest scholastic record during his high school career.
