Remember that Libraries are the  of Every Community !

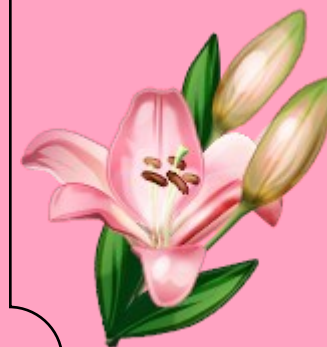
Summer Reading Program

- * Adults– Novel Destinations



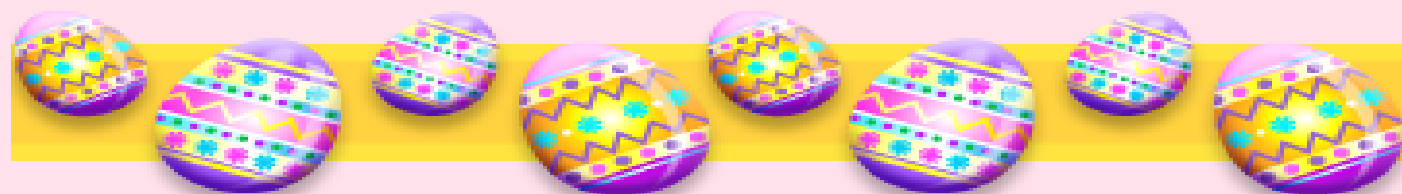

Register early to hold your spot in the class!

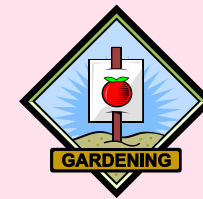
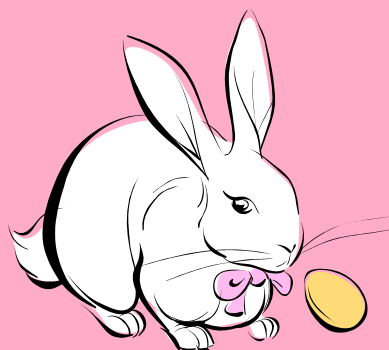
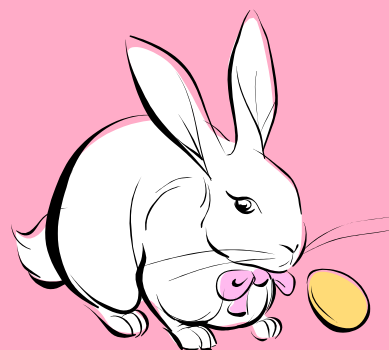

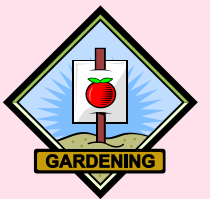
The last class for this program will be for GROUTING ONLY. It will be:
